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Introduction

Thank you for purchasing the Bitesize Sessions: Volume 1 by Sophra Books.

We wrote this workbook series called the 'Bitesize Sessions' as a direct response to our readers'

desire to read and engage in Korean learning materials at their own pace.

We crafted this workbook with the knowledge that our readers might not have lots of time and so we created short sessions to be completed in 20 minutes or less. The texts provide useful grammar and vocabulary that can be used in daily life and are targeted to pre-intermediate/ high beginner level learners – learners who have a good knowledge of Korean before using this workbook.

The idea of this workbook is to use it every day for 20 days – the length of sessions in this book.

Readers who consistently use this workbook will see the advantages such as improved reading speed, comprehension of the Korean text with less dependency on the translation and ending the workbook feeling accomplished. Readers will be exposed to new words, lots of repetition and interactive activities to make learning fun – especially when time is limited.

We opened Sophora Books in 2020 with a vision to create fun, easy-to-read short stories.

We have designed our resources to be a roadmap for language learners.

We started Sophora Books by publishing our graded reader series, the 'Korean Classic Reader' series in 2021 which reimagined English classics as novellas tailored for pre-intermediate Korean-language learners. These graded readers were just the beginning of our library.

We have added the 'Bitesize Sessions' series to expand our library for readers who want to use stories to learn about different topics. This series is designed to cover a diverse range of topics and interests useful for expanding grammar and vocabulary knowledge, practising spelling and reading entirely in Korean to become more confident in the skill of reading in Korean.

How to use this book

The Bitesize Sessions has 20 stories separated by 20 days so you can complete this workbook over a 20-day period or use it among other materials and return to it in your own time.

Page one of any day has the following:

Every section is split into an introduction page with the topic, style and tense.

The topic will highlight the type of content you will read about.

The style will tell you whether the text is an 'honorific and polite story,' 'casual and polite story' or a 'casual conversation'

The texts will be in the present, past tense or a mixture of the two.

Page two of any day has the following:

You will see which day you are on (Story #) with a list of the upcoming vocabulary for that day. You can use this space to translate for your own references should you wish to use the vocabulary as a reference page later on.

Page three of any day has the following: "Let's Read"

This page has the short story with the footnotes and the track number for the audio. You will see this page has lots of space for you to make notes on should you need it.

Page four of any day has the following: "Focused Reading"

This page is entirely in Korean with the translation at the bottom left of the page. You can cover the translation and focus on the Korean. Here you can practice reading aloud. With lots of space, you can make your notes around the text.

Page five of any day has the following: "Word Search"

Here you will find a word search with the words from the footnotes. Word searches help you improve spelling skills, learn new words and enhances short-term memory so do take a moment to complete the word search – or at least attempt it.

Day six of any day has the following: "Let's Review"

The review page is for you to consolidate what you have just learned/reviewed in the session and a chance to practice before you put the workbook down for the day. It is made for you to do a little translation practice where you have to fill in the blanks based on the English sentences in the review.


