

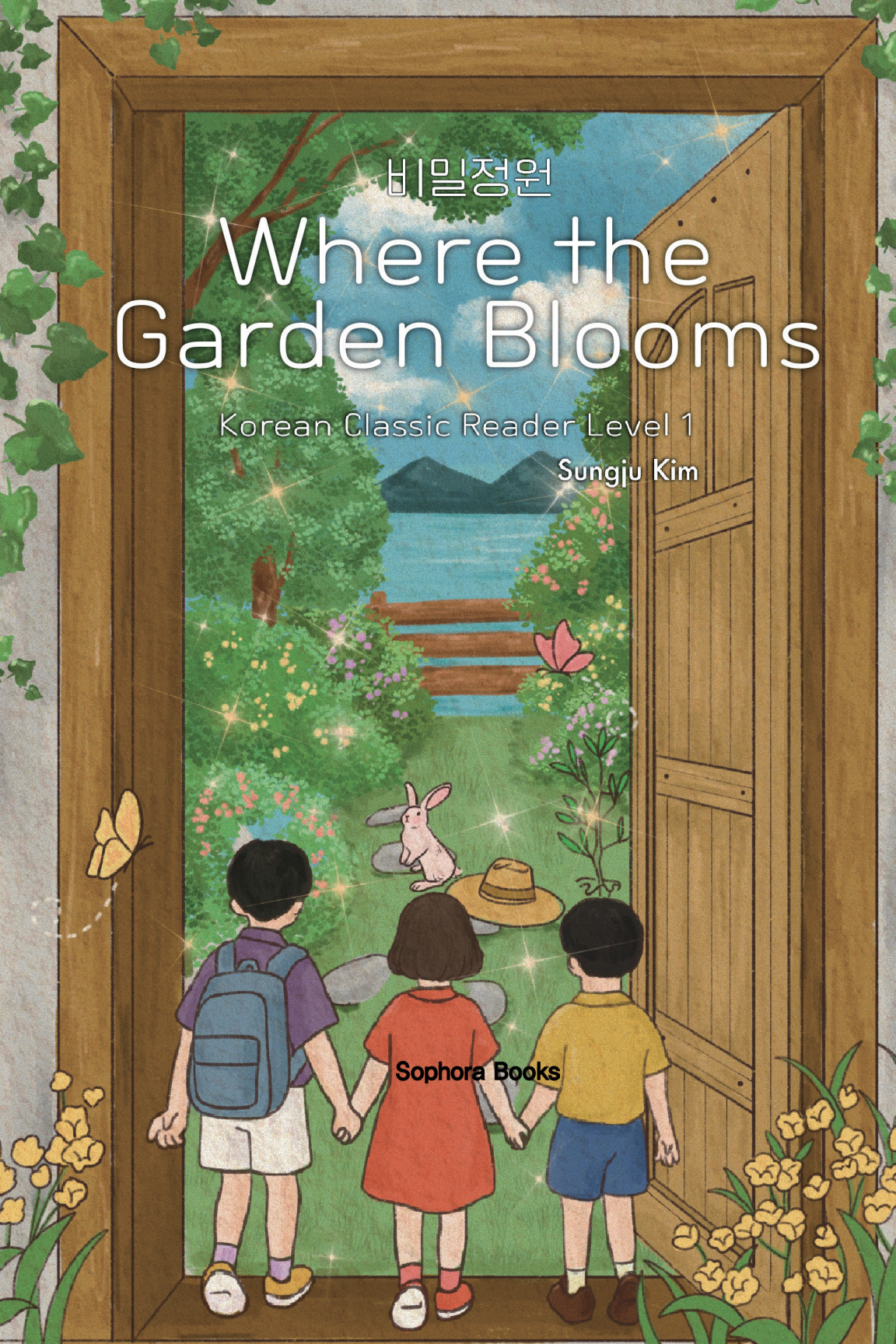

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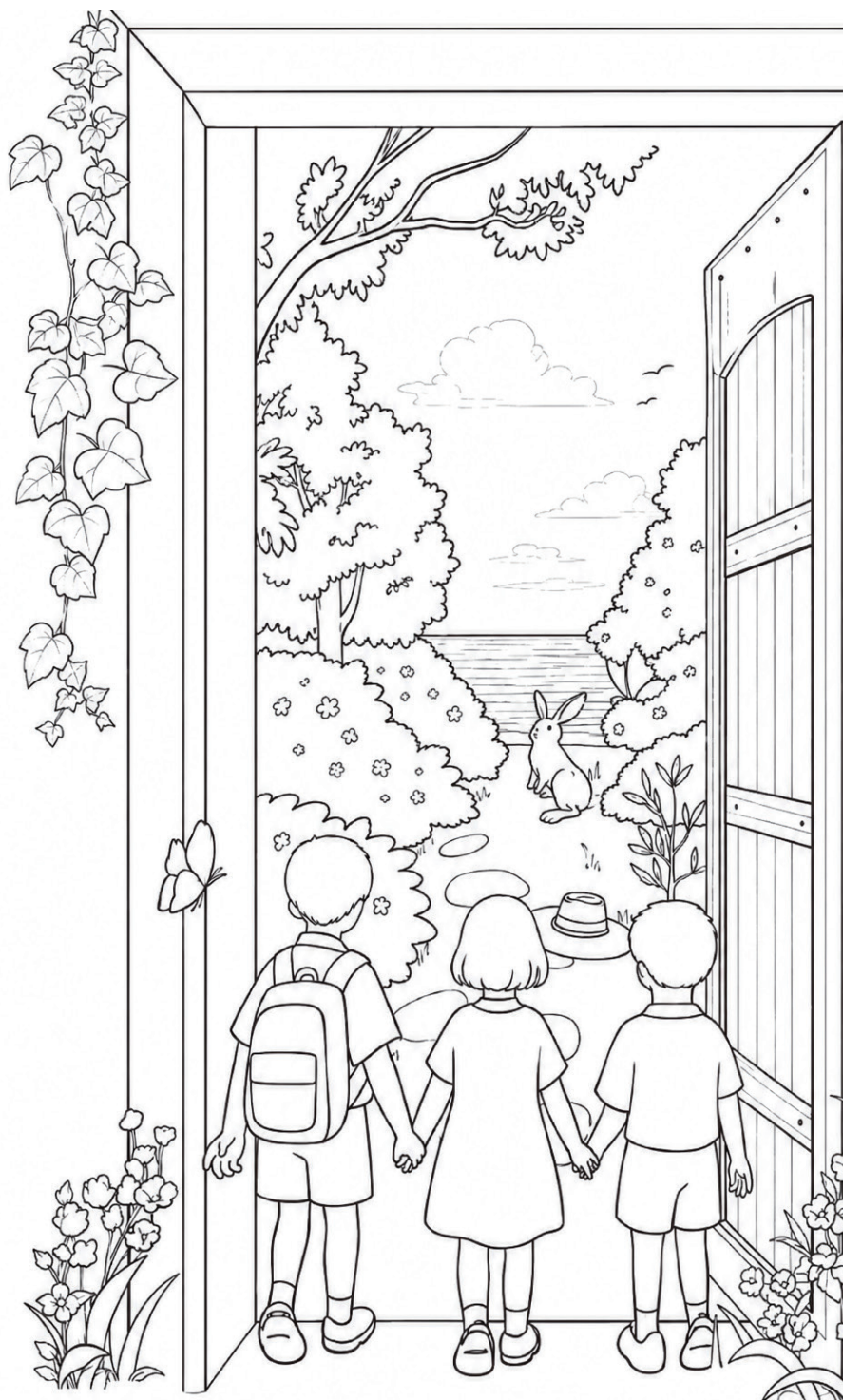

Adaptation Notes

This story is a gentle Korean adaptation inspired by *The Secret Garden* by Frances Hodgson Burnett. While not a direct translation, it reimagines the heart of the original – emotional healing, inner growth, and the quiet transformation that comes from friendship and nature.

Set in early 1980s Korea, the story follows Sujin, a reserved girl who moves to Geoje Island after losing her family. There, she meets Jimin, a quiet boy with his own unspoken sadness, and Minjae, whose warmth brings light to their lives. Together, they discover a forgotten garden – and through it, a way to reconnect with themselves and with each other.

In this retelling, we've adapted the original themes to reflect Korean culture, landscapes, and emotions, offering learners a story that feels both deeply local and universally human. The rhythms of island life, traditional family dynamics, and the significance of seasons in Korean life all add layers of meaning to the story.

This book is part of the Korean Classic Reader series, designed for low-intermediate learners of Korean (Level 1).

- The vocabulary is carefully selected from the TOPIK I level
- Key expressions are naturally repeated for ease of learning
- Each chapter is short and approachable
- A glossary of essential words is included at the end to support your reading

Whether you've read the original or are discovering this story for the first time, we hope this Korean retelling offers you both a language learning experience and a moment of quiet reflection – like stepping into a hidden garden.

Who is Sophora Books?

A warm-hearted and curious boy who helps Sujin and Jimin discover the joys of nature. He brings energy and kindness into their lives.

It's South Korea's second largest island, connected to the mainland by the Geoje Bridge.

It's home to hidden gardens, quiet villages, and traditional Korean homes, making it the perfect backdrop for a story about healing and emotional transformation.

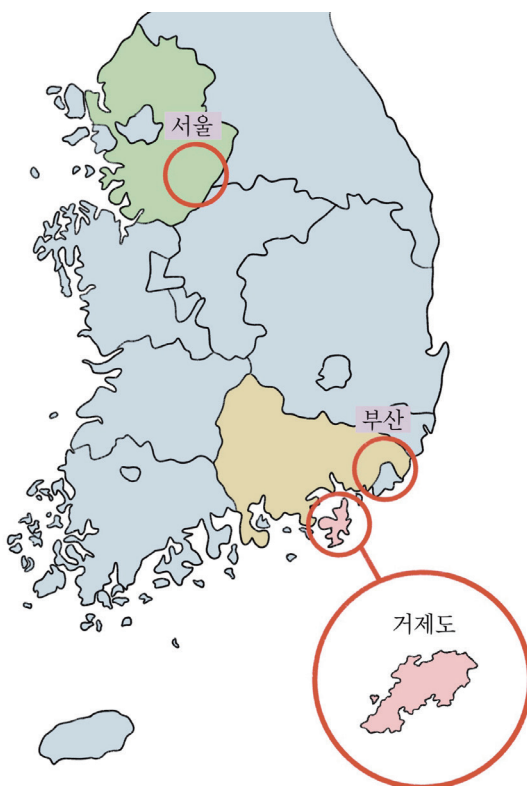

Before You Read

비밀정원 (Where the Garden Blooms) is a gentle story about loss, friendship, and healing, set on Geoje Island in the early 1980s. Before you begin, take a moment with the ideas and words below. You do not need to answer perfectly – just start thinking in Korean.

- Behind the house is a locked door – and a garden that no one visits anymore.
- As the garden slowly comes back to life, so do the people who care for it.

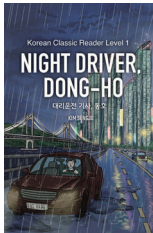
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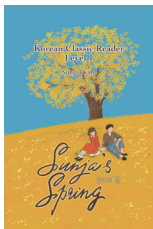

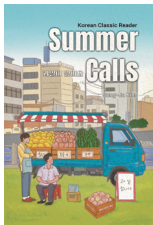
대리운전 기사, 동호 *Night Driver, Dong-ho*
